Did you know...?



Groundhog Day is celebrated in the U.S. each year on February 2nd. On this day in mid-winter, the groundhog awakens from a long winter's nap, and goes outside of his den to see if he sees his shadow. According to tradition, if the groundhog sees his shadow (a sunny morning), there will be six more weeks of winter. He then returns to his den and goes back to sleep. If the groundhog does not see his shadow, spring is just around the corner.

Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania is the site of the annual Ground Hog event. Our little rodent friend (yes, groundhogs are classified as rodents) is called Punxsutawney Phil. There are a few other "predictors" around the country, but they all pale in comparison to Phil's ability to predict the remainder of winter. For the record, Phil sees his shadow about 9 out of 10 times.
